Background

- Overview of the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) (Pub. L. 113-128)
- Commitment to providing high-quality services for youth and young adults (ages 14-24)
- References: WIOA (Pub. L. 113-128), 20 CFR §
 681.410



- General Eligibility Requirements
 - Target Groups
 - In-School Youth (ISY)
 - Out-of-School Youth (OSY)
- Core Eligibility Criteria
 - Age
 - Low-Income Status
 - Barriers to employment



- Self-Attestation see TEGL 23-19, Change 2 and TEGL 10-23
 - TEGL 23-19, Change 2
 - Provides detailed guidance on acceptable documentation
 - TEGL 10-23
 - Self-attestation is sufficient for both eligibility determination and data validation purposes



- Low-Income Eligibility Exception Rule see 20 CFR § 681.250
 - Five Percent Rule
 - Eligibility Requirements
 - Specific Criteria for OSY



- Reporting Youth Barriers see TEGL 09-22
 - Ensures appropriate Allocation of resources
 - Enhances understanding of the challenges faced by youth
 - Accurate data collection for better program management
